# Message from the Chairman

Shipmates, Ladies and Gentlemen,

It is with much regret I have to report the death of two of our members. On 9<sup>th</sup> January Jack Kiddle crossed the bar after a short period in hospital at the age of 89. He was buried on 20<sup>th</sup> January at Netherhampton Church. His close friends Dick and Betty Turner and myself, representing the Association, attended his funeral service, which was held at St Mary & St Nicholas Church, Wilton. Jack was a stoker in Hood from 1935 to 1938 and was discharged from the Royal Navy in 1947 as a Leading Hand after 12 years service. Jack had been an active member of the Association since its inception in 1975. He will be sorely missed.

Felix Neville-Towle, who only joined the Association in July last year, passed away on 1<sup>st</sup> December at the age of 85. He served in Hood as a midshipman from January to July 1938. Felix had been awarded the Distinguished Service Cross for service in HMS Vesper in October 1942. He retired from the Royal Navy with the rank of Commander after 33 years service. In the past, Felix had attended several of the memorial services at Boldre Church. Keith Evans, our Vice-Chairman, represented the Association at his funeral service at St Leonard's Church, Bursledon on 9<sup>th</sup> December.

Our AGM and Reunion Dinner will take place on 21<sup>st</sup> May this year. The Guest of Honour this year is to be Frank Pavey. Last year the Dinner was attended by almost 90 participants, slightly up on recent years. I would like to see even more attending this time. We have maintained the price of tickets at £18 per person by increasing the subsidy from our funds. Please make every effort to attend.



# Naval Review at Spithead 28th June 2005

The gathering of ships from many Nations at Spithead is in celebration of the Bye-Centenary of Vice Admiral Lord Nelson's victory on 21<sup>st</sup> October 1805. This rare spectacle of Warships at anchor will be well worth seeing as another occasion may not occur again for many years to come, if ever. Her Majesty The Queen will review the ships during the afternoon by sailing up and down between the lines.

There are two other events taking place at Portsmouth around this time, Drum Head on 29<sup>th</sup> June, an opportunity for veterans and old comrades to meet, and the International Festival of the Sea 30<sup>th</sup> July – 3<sup>rd</sup> August.

### Friends of The National Maritime Museum Greenwich

This is the World's largest maritime museum and a treasure house of our island's seafaring heritage. This year they are having an exhibition commemorating the 200th anniversary of the Battle of Trafalgar, this is the first exhibition to explore together the lives of two dominant leaders and adversaries, Horatio Nelson and Napoleon Bonaparte.
